



Renewed Restrictions for Italy

Airconsult, part of our global vendor network, worked with our World Fuel Trip Support team to provide the latest information regarding the Italian government's renewed restrictions for Italy. We recommend reviewing each country on the trip route before starting the setup of the flight, as well as before the actual departure. The World Fuel Trip Support Team is available 24/7 to check the latest restrictions to support your trip requirements.

Below are the new regulations:

TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS/REGULATIONS

1. **Travel within Italy and to/from EU Countries, Schengen area Countries, UK & Northern Ireland, Andorra, Monaco, San Marino and Vatican State:** allowed without limitations.
2. **Travel to/from ALGERIA, AUSTRALIA, CANADA, GEORGIA, JAPAN, MONTENEGRO, MOROCCO, NEW ZEALAND, RWANDA, SERBIA, REPUBLIC OF KOREA, THAILAND, TUNISIA, URUGUAY:** allowed but passengers have to perform a 14 days quarantine period in self-isolation. Exceptions to mandatory self-isolation are listed at Point 5 below.
3. **Entry into Italy is not permitted for persons travelling from, or who have transited in the 14 days prior their arrival in Italy, in one of the following countries:** Armenia, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Brazil, Bosnia Herzegovina, Chile, Kuwait, Northern Macedonia, Moldavia, Oman, Panama, Peru, Dominican Republic
4. **Travel from/to countries different from those listed at Points 1, 2 and 3 above:** Until the 31st of July permitted only for purposes listed at Point 5 below.
5. **Exceptions to mandatory self-isolation for arrivals from countries listed at Point 2 above & permitted reasons of travel for persons arriving from countries listed at Point 4 above:**
 - a. Crew members or any airline staff coming to Italy for work purposes (up to 120 hours)
 - b. Persons travelling for proven work reasons, if citizens of or resident in one of the following countries: Italy, Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Croatia, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden and Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Switzerland, Andorra, Monaco, Republic of San Marino, Vatican City State, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland;

- c. Sanitary or Health personnel travelling to Italy for professional purposes;
- d. Employees of companies with their main or secondary headquarters in Italy, returning to the country after travelling abroad, for work, for no more than 120 hours (5 days);
- e. Travel to and from the Republic of San Marino and the Vatican City State;
- f. Officials and other servants of the European Union, international organisations, diplomatic missions and consulates, military personnel in the performance of their duties;
- g. Students attending study programmes abroad and returning home at least once a week;
- h. Persons travelling to Italy for a short stay (up to 120 hours in total) for proven work, urgent or health reasons;
- i. Transit passengers;

All passengers arriving into Italy from abroad must compile the attached self-certification module "SELF CERTIFICATION – PERSONS ARRIVING FROM ABROAD". The Self Certification module must be in 2 copies, one for the passenger to present to local Authorities upon request, and one kept by the Carrier in case Authorities request it. For practicality we suggest that Carrier copy of the module are given to the crew upon departure and collected by our staff upon arrival in Italy.

INTERPERSONAL DISTANCING ON BOARD

Social distancing regulations have been renewed. Please remember social distancing does not apply to groups of passengers living in the same household.

CONDITIONS TO WAIVE INTERPERSONAL DISTANCING ON BOARD – ALL CONDITIONS HAVE TO BE RESPECTED FOR WAIVER TO APPLY.

1. Air on board is renewed every three minutes, the flows are vertical, and the filters adopted are HEPA;
2. Temperature measurement is taken before access to the aircraft (both foreign airports and Italian airports) and boarding is prohibited in case of temperature above 37.5°. All Italian airports are already organized for temperature control when passengers enter the terminal on arrival and on departure. No need for airlines to provide own temperature control. Exception to the above is the following:
 - i. **FCO:** Temperature must also be done at the gate prior to boarding. Airport Authority (ADR) has installed a centralised temperature control at all gates. No need for the airline to provide own temperature control.

3. The Carrier must ensure that surgical masks are not used more than 4 hours on board the aircraft;
4. Boarding/deboarding and seating are disciplined in order to avoid close contacts among passengers.
5. Self-certification is obtained from the travellers, upon check-in online or at the airport and in any case before boarding, both from a foreign country to Italy and from Italy to a foreign country, attesting the following:
 - i. that the passenger has not had close contact with any person known to have contracted COVID- 19 disease – as from two days prior to such person showing symptoms of the disease to 14 days after such symptoms were detected.
 - ii. the commitment from the passenger that, in case of onset of any COVID19 symptoms within an 8-day period from disembarking he will advise the Carrier and the local sanitary authorities

The Italian Ministry of Health issued a “SELF CERTIFICATION – SOCIAL DISTANCING” requirement. Electronic compilation is preferred. The Self Certification must be kept by the Carrier in case authorities request it. For practicality we suggest it is kept in Italy as follows:

- incoming modules are given to the crew upon departure and collected by our staff upon arrival in Italy
 - outgoing modules are collected by us before boarding and kept on station
6. Overhead lockers can now be used – Airlines are encouraged to develop a hand luggage policy that limits passenger co-mingling as much as possible.
 7. Passenger personal garments (i.e. jackets, coats, sweaters, etc.) that need to be put in the overhead lockers must be placed into bags that are supplied by the Airline for this purpose.

Please note that, as much as we strive to keep you always updated on all regulatory/sanitary/operational developments, the number and complexity of the different prescriptions does not always facilitate this task. Please appreciate that new rules may be introduced at any time with little or no advance notice.
