BUSINESS FLIGHT RESTRICTIONS

- The following nationals with tourism purpose are allowed to enter Bali (WADD/DPS), Batam (WIDD/BTH) or Tanjung Pinang (WIDN/TNJ):
 - Bahrain
 - China
 - Hungary
 - India
 - Italy
 - Japan
 - South Korea
 - Kuwait
 - Liechtenstein
 - Norway
 - France
 - UAE
 - Poland
 - Portugal
 - Qatar
 - KSA
 - New Zealand
 - Spain
 - Sweden

- Requirements:
 - a. E-visit tourist visa with visa number ending with LN
 - b. Confirmed booking of accommodation
 - c. Medical insurance with minimal coverage of USD 100,000- for COVID-19 treatment.



- d. Passengers & crew must have a negative COVID-19 PCR or RT-PCR test taken at most 72 hours before departure from the first embarkation point. The test result must be in English
- e. Passengers must have a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated at least 14 days before departure. The certificate must be issued in both English and a local language of the country where passengers were vaccinated
- f. Passengers are subject to a COVID-19 PCR test upon arrival + on the 6th day and quarantine for up to 7 days

- Non-tourism purposes are only allowed to enter Indonesia via Jakarta (WIII/CGK or WIHH/HLP), Surabaya (WARR/SUB) or Manado (WAMM/MDC).

Passengers

- Must hold a printed negative COVID-19 PCR or RT-PCR test taken at most 72 hours before departure from the first embarkation point, as well as a fully completed E-HAC.
- To show a card or certificate (physical or digital) stating travelers is fully vaccinated against COVID-19.
- Foreigners who are already in Indonesia and will travel, both domestically and internationally, are required to vaccinate through a program or mutual cooperation scheme in accordance with statutory regulations.
- Indonesian citizens that are not vaccinated will be inoculated during the quarantine. This does not apply to:
 - Foreigners who hold diplomatic visas and service visas related to official/state visits of foreign officials at ministerial level and above and foreigners who enter Indonesia under the Travel Corridor Arrangement scheme, according to the principle of reciprocity while still implementing strict health protocols
 - Foreigners who have not been vaccinated and intend to travel domestically and continue with the aim of taking international flights out of the Republic of Indonesia are allowed not to show their COVID-19 vaccination card/certificate as long as they do not leave the airport area during transit waiting for the international flight, provided that the traveler:
 - has been permitted by the local Port Health Office to carry out domestic trips with the aim of being able to continue their flights out of Indonesia; and
 - shows the schedule of flight tickets outside Indonesia for direct transit from the city of departure to the international airport in the territory of the Republic of Indonesia with the final destination to the destination country.
- International travelers under 18 years of age
- The following airports only can be used to enter and leave Indonesia via air travel.



- Jakarta – CGK/WIII
 - Jakarta – HLP/WIHH
 - Bali – DPS/WADD
 - Manado – MDC/WAMM
 - Riau Islands – TNJ/WIDN
- Entry Requirements - All airports, except DPS/WADD and TNJ/WIDN

The following foreign travelers only may enter Indonesia under the new regulations:

- Diplomatic and Official visa holders.
 - Diplomatic and Official stay permit.
 - Holders of Indonesia Temporary Residence Card (KITAS) and Indonesia Permanent Residence Card (KITAP). Visit <https://izintinggal-online.imigrasi.go.id/> for more information.
 - Visitor visas, including but not limited to:
 - 211 A Visa.
This visa includes tourist, emergency, business, film, medical visit, official visit, yachters and G20 or the 144th International Parliamentary Union (IPU) meetings.
 - 211B Visa.
This visa includes foreign workers in probation.
 - Limited stay visa, including but not limited to:
 - C312 Visa (work visa);
 - C313 Visa (1-year foreign investment projects in Indonesia);
 - C314 Visa (2-year foreign investment projects in Indonesia);
 - C316 Visa (educational visits);
 - C317 Visa (family reunification)
 - All non-immigrant crew members or cabin crews arriving any vessel or aircraft from any port or place outside Indonesia. Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) Business Travel Card holder; and
 - Traditional Border Crossing pass/card holder.
- Entry Requirements - DPS/WADD and TNJ/WIDN airports

Citizens of the following 19 countries can enter Indonesia on tourist/limited stay visas.

They may enter Indonesia via Bali (Ngurah Rai International Airport) and or Riau Islands (Raja Haji Fisabilillah International Airport) only.



Saudi Arabia, United Arab Emirates, New Zealand, Kuwait, Bahrain, Qatar, China, India, Japan, South Korea, Liechtenstein, Italy, France, Portugal, Spain, Sweden, Poland, Hungary, and Norway.

They are required to possess:

- International health insurance with minimum coverage of USD 100,000, including but not limited to COVID-19 related treatment and hospitalization in Indonesia
- Hotel reservation and payment.
- Foreigners who have visited India in the past 14 days will be denied entry.

RESTRICTIONS FOR TECHNICAL REFUELING/CREW REST

- Air Crews Must hold a printed negative COVID-19 PCR or RT-PCR test taken at most 7 days before departure from the first embarkation point, as well as a fully completed E-HAC.

QUARANTINE REQUIREMENTS

- All International Travelers, both Indonesian Citizens (WNI) and foreign citizens (WNA) must adhere the terms/conditions as follows:
 - RT-PCR test will be performed on arrival and day 09 of quarantine; or day 13 for those required to undergo a 14-day quarantine.
 - a) Foreigners (Air Crew included)
 - 10-day quarantine at the cost of the traveler.
 - b) Indonesian citizens - Indonesian Migrant Workers (PMI); Student/student; or Government Employees who return from overseas official trips in accordance with the Decree of the Chairperson of the COVID-19 Handling Task Force Number 11 of 2021:
 - 10-day quarantine at the cost of the government.
 - c) Indonesian citizens other than b) and foreign diplomats, excluding the head of the foreign representative and the family of the head of the foreign representative. They shall undergo quarantine at a quarantine accommodation place that has obtained



certification for the implementation of COVID-19 quarantine accommodation by the Ministry of Health.

- 10-day quarantine at the cost of the traveler.

TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS

1. Foreigners who have lived or visited South Africa, Botswana, Namibia, Zimbabwe, Lesotho, Mozambique, Eswatini, and Nigeria within a period of 14 (fourteen) days before entry into Indonesia are not allowed to enter the country.

2. Temporary suspension of issuance of visit visas and limited stay visas for citizens of South Africa, Botswana, Namibia, Zimbabwe, Lesotho, Mozambique, Eswatini, and Nigeria.

This does not apply to:

- Holders of diplomatic visas, service visas and visit visas;
- Holders of diplomatic residence permits and official residence permits;
- Holders of limited stay permits (KITAS) and permanent residence permits (KITAP);
- Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (KPP APEC) Businessman Travel Card Holders;
- The crew of the conveyance that comes with the conveyance.
- Special consideration/permission in writing from the Ministry/Agency
- Travelers eligible to the bilateral Travel Corridor Arrangement (TCA) agreement scheme
- Indonesian citizens. They have to undergo a 14-day quarantine.
